

### **Remote Education Expectations**

Where a class, group or a small number of pupils need to self-isolate, or local restrictions require pupils to remain at home, we have the capacity to offer immediate remote education. We have a strong contingency plan in place for remote education provision and this can be seen below for each Phase/key stage. This planning is particularly important to support a scenario in which the logistical challenges of remote provision are greatest, for example where large numbers of pupils are required to remain at home

Remote Learning 2020/21 Action KS1/EYFS In September 2020, all our classes returned to full-time education following the Covid 19 closure in March.

Although we hope that the majority of our children will now have an uninterrupted experience, there is the possibility that an individual child, a class bubble, or indeed the whole school, will need to self-isolate for a period of time. We have therefore put in place a plan for remote learning so that all children can continue with their education.

Where parents are unable to access the school's virtual learning resources, hard copies will be made available

If a child does not have access to a computer/laptop and/or the internet, the school will do all it can to support children and will provide paper packs of learning. Where funding can be accessed, remote devices (eg, laptops) and/or 4G connections will be sought, particularly for disadvantaged children. Parents will be reminded to make the school aware of any barriers to accessing remote learning

The Oak National Academy

The 'teaching content' will be provided to children through age appropriate video content on the DfE published list of educational resources site; Oak National Academy website. This provides the equivalent of 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. In their 'classroom' each lesson is an hour-long. They're delivered by a teacher, with a pre-recorded video as well as quizzes, worksheets and creative activities. It's all easy to use, there's no login or password, and you can access the lessons on any device- pupils only need materials they can find at home. Providing feedback Pupils can send any completed learning to teachers via their school website - https://www.oakwoodinfantandnurseryschool.co.uk/ and/or Tapestry accounts Alternatively, work that children complete on paper should be kept safe and returned to school when safe to do so. Contact with pupils/ parents Parents are able to contact the school via telephone, direct school website - https://www.oakwoodinfantandnurseryschool.co.uk/ and/or Tapestry message and the school admin email address. Any response should be made within 48 hours during working hours.

Letters and Sounds



Reception are providing the links to online phonics lessons to support the children in learning to read. These lessons are designed to follow the phonics programme that the children have been learning at school and are the only Letters and Sounds lessons approved and funded by the Department for Education. These lessons provide a daily phonics lesson delivered by an expert, with a pre-recorded video.

#### **Busy Things**

Year 2 are providing age appropriate remote learning via the busy things website. This supports the home learning packs in providing 3 hours of lessons per day for primary school children. Each lesson has specific instructions to support the parents in delivering the lesson and includes worksheets, projects, quizzes and creative activities. It is easy to use and all each child needs to do is click on their name and input their passcode which they have all received. Feedback can be provided on the website <a href="www.busythings.co.uk">www.busythings.co.uk</a> and children can also complete on paper and then return to school or email to their class teacher. Responses are made within 48 hours during working hours.

Where a pupil is self-isolating on medical grounds for a significant period of time, contact will be made via telephone on a weekly basis to monitor learning and provide support if needed.

Pupils identified as vulnerable will be contacted by the schools Manager for Vulnerable Children on a weekly basis and support offered as necessary.
